Aim	To learn the basic sentence patterns, vocabulary, and Kanji characters of the beginner's level. Deepen intercultural understanding by learning about Japanese culture and customs. Along with language, students will deepen intercultural understanding by learning about Japanese culture, customs and personal relationships. Objectives	To be able to : 1. read and write Hiragana, Katakana and 150 Kanji characters. 2. read for instructional and directional purposes, standardized messages, phrases, or expressions. (e.g., menus, schedules, timetables, maps and signs) 3. satisfy partially the requirements of basic communicative exchanges by learned utterances. Can ask questions or make statements involving learned material. 4. write a simple self-introduction and fill out simple forms and documents.	To be able to: 1. read and write 300 Kanji. 2. read simple texts dealing with a variety of basic and social needs (e.g., short, straightforward descriptions of persons, places, and things written for a wide audience) 3. handle successfully a variety of uncomplicated, basic, and communicative tasks and social situations. 4. meet a number of practical writing needs. Can write short, simple letters (e.g., personal preferences, daily routine, everyday events, and other topics grounded in personal experiences)	To be able to: 1. read and write 500 Kanji characters. 2. read longer prose of several paragraphs with a clear underlying structure (e.g., simple short stories, and simple technical materials). 3. handle successfully most uncomplicated communicative tasks and social situations with a number of strategies appropriate to a range of circumstances and topics. 4. meet most practical writing needs and limited social demands (e.g., brief synopses and paraphrases, summaries of biographical data, work). Can take notes in some detail on familiar topics
